#### **PRESIDENTS REPORT 2013**

It has been a great honour to have been elected and served as VAFAUA President in 2013. It is my pleasure to present this report to our members, Life Members and past umpires as we embark on another year in 2014.

2013 was somewhat of a transitional year for the VAFAUA with a new president, vice president, secretary and treasurer. Whilst it was very pleasing to welcome new faces to the committee, we farewelled a number of experienced long standing members who service has been extremely valuable and will be built upon for years to come.

The first part of the year saw the committee embark on the hunt for potential sponsors and for a new uniform. Both were successful.

I would like to thank both Grant Wardrop and Ryan Robertson. The design, ordering and distribution of the new uniform was at times a second full time job. The amount of effort that these two put into ensuring the members were fitted out in a quality new product cannot be underestimated. Without their input the new uniform would simply not have been possible.

We continued to grow our membership and it was pleasing to see record numbers of boundary and goal umpires in 2013. This has placed us in a strong position to provide better umpires and more depth to the competition as a whole.

#### **TREASURER'S REPORT 2013**

The Association's financial year is 1<sup>st</sup> November to 30<sup>th</sup> October and therefore the Accounts reflect the activities of the Umpire's Association for the entire football season. This was my first year as Treasurer as a result of Dean Schwab's departure from the role due to his work commitments in his new position overseas. I would like to thank Dean for his continued commitment to this role over the last number of years.

The VAFA introduced Schedula to manage umpires' appointments for the 2013 season. The website greatly assisted my role in managing umpires' pay deductions for uniforms, subscriptions and the Pre-Finals dinner.

Season 2013 also saw the introduction of a new umpires' uniform featuring the logos of two of our new financial sponsors, Ledified Corporation and Bendigo Bank, East Malvern branch. These two sponsors increased our revenue for the year by \$5,500 on the previous year. Despite the practical challenges involved in distributing uniforms to more than 350 umpires, from a financial management perspective, our new uniforms payment website and the use of Paypal to collect some of our uniform revenue proved to be invaluable and ensured the smooth processing of sales. I would like to thank in particular the outgoing Secretary, Grant Wardrop for the time that he spent in introducing these systems.

In addition to the uniform sponsors, I would also like to thank Personal Mortgage Managers and the Harris Family Butchers in East Bentleigh for their contributions to the VAFAUA in 2013.

The Association made a financial loss of \$15,714 for the year. Although there were many revenue and expense items with minimal variances from the last financial year, there were numerous outgoings made during the 2013 financial year which contributed to the overall loss, including:

- increased spending on honourboard updates and trophies;
- reduced bar sales compared to the previous year;
- increased cost in holding the umpires Pre-Finals dinner; whereby the MCG catering company charged higher amounts compared to past years;
- increased expenditure towards VAFA related expenses, including subsidising representative umpires on their overseas VAFA trips to Ireland and New Zealand; and
- Recognising extraordinary items, such as accounting for a debt liable to the VAFA for uniform purchases made in past years (adjustment of close to \$9,000) which was inadvertently not recorded in prior year financial reports.

I would like to finish by thanking all the executives and members for continually supporting me in my role as treasurer and I look forward to continuing in the role in 2014.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 101: Presentation of Financial Statements AASB 107: Cash Flow Statements AASB 108: Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors AASB 110: Events after the Balance Sheet Date AASB 116: Property, Plant and Equipment AASB 138: Intangible Assets AASB 117: Leases AASB 118: Revenue AASB 118: Revenue AASB 1031: Materiality

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### (a) **Revenue recognition**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Amounts disclosed include GST and are net of any returns or discounts.

#### (b) Inventory

Inventories including bar stock, merchandise and sporting equipment are expensed when sold and are measured at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Inventories expected to be carried and sold over future years are capitalized as required.

#### (c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash includes cash on hand and money market deposits which are readily convertible to cash on hand and are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONT)

#### **1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT)**

#### (d) **Property, plant and equipment**

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost, less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Leasehold improvements and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, less any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciation amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use on a straight line method.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

Asset classes' carrying amounts are written down immediately to its recoverable amount if an asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount. Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the income statement.

#### (e) Intangible assets

Intangibles are amortised on a diminishing value basis over the period of their expected benefit. The assets' carrying amount and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

#### 2. AUDITORS REMUNERATION

No remuneration was paid for the audit of the 2013 financial statements as it was performed upon an honorary basis (2012: \$nil).

#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

#### VICTORIAN AMATEUR FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION UMPIRES ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Victorian Amateur Football Association Umpires Association Incorporated ("the Association"), which comprises the balance sheet as at 31 October 2013, the income statement and the cash flow statement for the year then ended, a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes.

#### Committee members' Responsibility for the Financial Report

The Committee Members of the entity are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report and have determined that the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements, which form part of the financial report, are appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The Committee Members' responsibility also includes designing, implementing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

#### Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used, as described in Note 1, are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. These Auditing Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Committee Members, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

The financial report has been prepared for distribution to members for the purpose of fulfilling the financial reporting requirements under the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria. We disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other that that for which it was prepared.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

#### Independence

In conducting our audit, we have complied with the independence requirements of the Australian professional accounting bodies.

#### Basis for Qualified Auditor's Opinion

Cash donations, fundraising events and social functions are a significant source of revenue for the Association. The Association has determined that it is impracticable to establish control over the collection of these sources of revenue prior to entry into its financial records. Accordingly, as the evidence available to us regarding revenue from these sources was limited, our audit procedures with respect to these sources of revenue had to be restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. We therefore are unable to express an opinion whether revenue from cash donations, fundraising events and social functions of the Association obtained is complete.

#### Qualified Auditor's Opinion

In our opinion, except for the effects on the financial report of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be required had the limitation on our audit procedures referred to in the preceding paragraph not existed, the financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Victorian Amateur Football Association Umpires Association Incorporated as of 31 October 2013 and its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements.
