#### PRESIDENTS REPORT 2014

It has been a great honour to have been elected and served as VAFAUA President over the past two seasons. It is my pleasure to present this report to our members, Life Members and past umpires as we embark on another year in 2015.

For the Executive, 2014 was a year of consolidation. The first job of the Executive after the 2013 season was to negotiate a new pay deal with the VAFA. I was pleased at the open and honest way Michael Sholly conducted the negotiations with myself and Greg Rolfe. With the outcome of the negotiations securing a 4% increase across the board and ensuring that all field and boundary umpires are paid the same rate for 3 umpire games rather than a reduced rate which had been the case in previous years.

Ideally the VAFAUA were after a deal lasting 3 years however from the negotiations the VAFA Board set up a sub-committee which focussed on all things umpiring and ultimately from this Brian Woodhead was appointed as the 'Head of Umpiring' at the VAFA. I would like to thank both David Anselmi and Ryan Robertson for volunteering their time and providing their substantial experience into the sub-committee.

In 2014 we had four wonderful sponsors. Personal Mortgage Managers, Harris Butchers, Bendigo Bank East Malvern Branch and LEDified. Sponsors are very hard to come by. Sponsorship money from all our sponsors goes a long way to help the VAFAUA provide services for its members. I encourage all members where possible to support our sponsors.

Our membership in 2014 grew and it was pleasing to see so many new umpires succeed. This has placed us in a strong position to provide better umpires and more depth to the competition as a whole and has strengthened the VAFAUA's financial position.

Our social functions were lacking support. Our trivia night in particular had a lot fewer umpires and friends attend then in 2013. This must change and all umpires should endeavour to attend all social functions. I would like to thank Tony Hales for all his hard work in running the trivia night. Again our pre finals dinner was strongly attended by current members, past members and club representatives and gets bigger and bigger every year. Wayne Campbell was a fantastic guest speaker and I would like to thank Russell Davidson for his tiresome work in organising the night and ensuring its success. For the last six seasons Russell has been the dinner coordinator and has worked very hard to ensure that everyone has an enjoyable night. Without people like Russell nights like the pre finals dinner could not go ahead. Russell is pursuing other interests in 2015 and his presence in the organisation will be sorely missed.

The Premier Grand Final luncheon was well attended and thanks once again to Mark Fine for being the MC.

I want to thank Andrew Green for his work not only in organising the Premier Grand Final Lunch but his outstanding work on Thursday evenings. He prepares and feeds us a wonderful dinner every week.

It has been the goal of this Executive to continue to strengthen the relationship we have built with the VAFA. I would like to thank VAFA President Michael Hazell, CEO Michael Sholly and the staff of the VAFA for all their support, assistance and open appreciation of the work we do. We are very lucky to have such support.

Thank you also to Brian 'Benny' Goodman. Benny, also a Life Member of the VAFAUA has been a tremendous supporter of myself and the committee in 2014.

#### **TREASURER'S REPORT 2014**

The Association's financial year is 1<sup>st</sup> November to 30<sup>th</sup> October and therefore the Accounts reflect the activities of the Umpire's Association for the entire football season. This was my second year as Treasurer.

Two of our sponsors, Ledified Corporation and Bendigo Bank, East Malvern branch, whose logos appear on our umpires uniform, recommitted for a further year as uniform sponsors in season 2014. I would like to thank our two uniform sponsors, along with Personal Mortgage Managers and Harris Family Butchers in East Bentleigh, for their contributions as sponsors and business partners to the VAFAUA in 2014.

The increase in our umpires' list on the previous year contributed towards the increase in subscriptions income by \$2,793 or 11% compared to 2013. Despite the increase in umpire participation in the VAFA, this increase did not necessarily translate to higher income from social events and bar sales. Poor umpires' attendance figures to post-training meetings and association meetings contributed negatively to profitability from social activities. One of the major responsibilities that needs to be addressed by the 2015 committee will include how new association members can be better engaged in our organization and how participation numbers can be increased to our numerous social events held during the year.

Beginning from 2016, the VAFAUA will have new umpires' uniforms and the 2015 committee will explore the various options to ensure that association members are provided with cost-effective uniforms. The committee is also keen on ensuring that the amount of umpire stock held in our clubrooms is kept to a minimum going forward as past trends indicate that our substandard uniform stocking and ordering practices have burdened the VAFAUA financially.

The Association made a financial profit of \$6,315 in 2014 (compared to the \$15,513 loss in 2013). As the 2013 financial results included many extraordinary items to correct misstated balances from prior years, the 2014 results better reflect the association's yearly financial performance.

Many VAFAUA members were concerned with the loan that is owing to the VAFA for the uniforms purchased by HQ in past years. The VAFAUA will make concerted efforts to ensure that the remaining balance of \$16,520 at 31 October 2014 is eliminated by the end of season 2015, as this will also streamline the administrative complexities that have arisen in monthly payruns.

I would like to finish by thanking all the executive, committee and association members for continually supporting me in my role as treasurer and I look forward to continuing in the role in 2015.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 101: Presentation of Financial Statements

AASB 107: Cash Flow Statements

AASB 108: Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

AASB 110: Events after the Balance Sheet Date

AASB 116: Property, Plant and Equipment

AASB 138: Intangible Assets

AASB 117: Leases AASB 118: Revenue AASB 1031: Materiality

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### (a) Revenue recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Amounts disclosed include GST and are net of any returns or discounts.

#### (b) Inventory

Inventories including bar stock, merchandise and sporting equipment are expensed when sold and are measured at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Inventories expected to be carried and sold over future years are capitalized as required.

#### (c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash includes cash on hand and money market deposits which are readily convertible to cash on hand and are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONT)

#### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT)

#### (d) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost, less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Leasehold improvements and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, less any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciation amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use on a straight line method.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Building improvements	2.5%
Furniture & fittings	6.5%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

Asset classes' carrying amounts are written down immediately to its recoverable amount if an asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount. Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the income statement.

#### (e) Intangible assets

Intangibles are amortised on a diminishing value basis over the period of their expected benefit. The assets' carrying amount and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

#### 2. AUDITORS REMUNERATION

No remuneration was paid for the audit of the 2014 financial statements as it was performed upon an honorary basis (2013: \$nil).

#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

## VICTORIAN AMATEUR FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION UMPIRES ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Victorian Amateur Football Association Umpires Association Incorporated ("the Association"), which comprises the balance sheet as at 31 October 2014, the income statement and the cash flow statement for the year then ended, a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes.

Committee members' Responsibility for the Financial Report

The Committee Members of the entity are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report and have determined that the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements, which form part of the financial report, are appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The Committee Members' responsibility also includes designing, implementing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

#### Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used, as described in Note 1, are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. These Auditing Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Committee Members, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

The financial report has been prepared for distribution to members for the purpose of fulfilling the financial reporting requirements under the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria. We disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other that that for which it was prepared.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

#### Independence

In conducting our audit, we have complied with the independence requirements of the Australian professional accounting bodies.

#### Basis for Qualified Auditor's Opinion

Cash donations, fundraising events and social functions are a significant source of revenue for the Association. The Association has determined that it is impracticable to establish control over the collection of these sources of revenue prior to entry into its financial records. Accordingly, as the evidence available to us regarding revenue from these sources was limited, our audit procedures with respect to these sources of revenue had to be restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. We therefore are unable to express an opinion whether revenue from cash donations, fundraising events and social functions of the Association obtained is complete.

#### Qualified Auditor's Opinion

In our opinion, except for the effects on the financial report of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be required had the limitation on our audit procedures referred to in the preceding paragraph not existed, the financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Victorian Amateur Football Association Umpires Association Incorporated as of 31 October 2014 and its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements.
