#### **TREASURER'S REPORT 2015**

The Association's financial year is 1<sup>st</sup> November to 30<sup>th</sup> October and therefore the Accounts reflect the activities of the Umpire's Association for the entire football season. This was my third year as Treasurer.

Two of our sponsors, LEDified Corporation and Bendigo Bank, East Malvern branch, whose logos appear on our umpire uniform, recommitted for the last year of the pre-existing three-year uniform sponsorship arrangement in 2015. I would like to thank our two uniform sponsors, along with Personal Mortgage Managers for their contributions as sponsors and business partners to the VAFAUA in 2015.

The Association made a financial surplus of \$2,711 in 2015 (compared to a surplus amounting to \$6,315 in 2014).

Given that overall expenditure in 2015 was lower compared to 2014, the major item contributing towards the lower surplus amount in 2015 was our sales of umpires' uniform (down 42% from the prior year). The overall financial performance of the association was plagued by the KooGa uniform deal in place between seasons 2013 - 2015 and the 2016 committee will ensure that the introduction of the new uniforms in season 2016 will provide better financial outcomes for the association moving forward.

The VAFAUA made concerted efforts to reduce the financial debt owing to the VAFA in season 2015. The association paid back \$3,940 to the HQ during 2015 and we should be able to further reduce the liability in 2016.

I would like to finish by thanking all the executive, committee and association members for continually supporting me in my role as treasurer and I look forward to continuing in the role in 2016.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012* (the Act). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements:

#### (a) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account and trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognizing revenue. Interest revenue is recognized using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Amounts disclosed include goods and services tax.

#### (b) Inventory

Inventories including bar stock, merchandise and sporting equipment are expensed when sold and are measured at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Inventories expected to be carried and sold over future years are capitalized as required.

#### (c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other shortterm highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONT)

#### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT)

#### (d) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost, less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Leasehold improvements and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, less any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciation amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use on a straight line method.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

Asset classes' carrying amounts are written down immediately to its recoverable amount if an asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount. Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the income statement.

#### (e) Intangible assets

Intangibles are amortised on a straight line basis over the period of their expected benefit. The assets' carrying amount and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

#### Opinion

In our opinion, the financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Victorian Amateur Football Association Umpires Association Incorporated as at 31 October 2015 and its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements, and the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act (Vic).

#### **Basis of Accounting and Restriction on Distribution**

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist Victorian Amateur Football Association Umpires Association Incorporated to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Reform Act 2012 (Vic). As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.
